Application Process

- Applications must be typed and complete to be considered.
 - Short Answer Essays: Answer all 3; limit responses to 200 words or less.
- ❖ Please attach one (1) reference letter; This letter should be from an adult who knows you well, other than a parent or relative. For example: scout leader, employer, community leader, clergy, or someone within the school system, etc.
- Application must be signed by both candidate and guardians.
- ❖ Letters notifying the applicants of the selection committee's results will be delivered to the school liaisons the first week of April. Homeschoolers letters will be mailed.

Youth Leadership Hall County Selection Criteria

Nominees must have the full support of the schools, principals, and their guardians.

- Attendance at the monthly session is <u>mandatory</u> unless an emergency arises.
- Class members are chosen on their own merits based upon the information completed in the application. All work needs to be the original work of the applicant. For best results, you are encouraged to have someone proofread your work prior to submission.
- ❖ **Do not over commit yourself.** If you have extra-curricular sports or events, IB, AP, Dual Enrollment, etc., you will still need to be able to participate in the FULL class day each month.
- Incomplete applications will not be accepted.
- ❖ There will be NO in-person interviews. Because of this, careful attention will be paid to each application. Make sure that your application is reflective of who you are and the image you want portrayed. Excellent applications will be detailed, thoughtful, and formatted properly on each page with correct grammar and punctuation.

Incomplete Applications will NOT be considered.

Youth Leadership Hall is designed for youth that are beginning to show leadership potential. The day-long programs are intended to develop leadership skills and community awareness.

3. In your opinion, what is the most challenging issue facing the Hall County area today? Describe
how you would correct the problem if resources were unlimited.

Tuition Commitment

After acceptance, participants will be required to pay a \$75 one-time fee to help offset some of the expenses.

Public/Private High Schoolers: This fee is submitted to the high school where the student is enrolled. The high school then sends one all-inclusive payment to GHCC.

Homeschoolers: Those selected participants will need to have a parent become a member of the Chamber. This is to offset the cost of transportation, logistics, chaperones, and support that the school systems all offer as members. The \$75 fee will be invoiced directly to your parent as well membership.

Attendance and Behavior Agreement

- ❖ If chosen as a member of Youth Leadership Hall, I understand I must agree to attend the <u>entire day</u> of all mandatory program sessions (including the Kick-Off and Graduation) in order to graduate from the YLH program. There are a total of 8 programs and 7 are school days. The Kick-off is in the evening.
- ❖ Monthly sessions are generally held on the first or second Tuesday of each month. Sessions generally run from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. **Schedules need to be planned accordingly.** Once teams are assigned, there are no swapping days for make-ups.
- ❖ If you have a test on a YLH scheduled day, please make arrangements well in advance to take your test on an alternate day so that you can attend all mandatory YLH events.
- ❖ I understand that there will be a mandatory survey to complete after each program date. I must complete this survey in a timely manner.
- ❖ Students are responsible for transportation to and from the program day site. Transportation will be provided by school bus during the day. Students are not allowed to follow the bus in their personal cars.
- ❖ I understand the dress code for each program will be YLH T-shirts and pants. No open toe shoes. The one exception is on Government Day when we visit the Capitol. Required dress code is business.
- ❖ I agree to uphold a moral obligation to Youth Leadership Hall to behave in a manner that is professional and appropriate.
- I understand that I will be removed from the program if I participate in anything that is illegal and/or morally questionable, including embarrassing myself, my family, my school, Youth Leadership Hall or the Greater Hall Chamber of Commerce. I also understand that I may be removed from the YLH program for defiance, disrespect, poor attitude or refusing to participate in scheduled activities.
